

Commission proposal on the welfare of dogs and cats and their traceability

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Reasons to act at EU level

- Citizens' expectations
- Divergence of national rules => unsmooth functioning of the internal market, unlevel playing field + uneven protection of animals
- Grey market / illegal trade => unlevel playing field + animal welfare problems
 + lack of consumer protection
- Lack of animal welfare rules at import
- Background: EFSA scientific and technical report; voluntary initiative on pets;
 EU enforcement action
- SWD summarising supporting evidence: March 2024





General

- Internal market
- Welfare for dogs and cats
- Limit opportunities for fraud
- Protection of acquirers

Specific

- Minimum standards for establishments breeding/keeping dogs and cats
- Traceability of dogs and cats supplied in the EU (including online)
- Additional rules for entry into the EU
- Awareness on responsible ownership
- Competence of animal caretakers



What is covered?

• The keeping of dogs and cats in establishments



- Breeding establishments = reproduction and placing puppies or kittens on the market
- Pet shops = placing dogs and cats on the market (without being born there)
- <u>Shelters</u> = keeping of unwanted, abandoned, former stray, lost or confiscated animals
- The placing on the market and the supplying of dogs and cats




- Placing on the market = offered against money (with or without benefit)
- Supplying = any transfer of ownership (except occasional supplies offline)
- Excludes dogs and cats intended for scientific purposes





Establishments – Exemptions



- Breeding up to 3 females with 2 litters or less per establishment and per year
- Pet shops with up to 3 dogs or 6 cats
- Shelters with up to 10 dogs or 20 cats
- Exempted from animal welfare requirements for establishments but subject to identification and registration requirements for animals



Establishments – General obligations

- Compliance with animal welfare principles
- Enough skilled animal caretakers
- Non harmful breeding strategies
 - **Inline breeding** forbidden (parent x offspring or grandparent x grandchild)
- Informing acquirers on responsible ownership. Warning on responsible ownership if advertised online.
- Competence of animal caretakers
- Animal welfare visits by a veterinarian





Establishments – Specific obligations (1)

- Feeding and watering
 - Frequency, colostrum, weaning age
- Housing [transition: 5 years]
 - No keeping dogs or cats in containers
 - No keeping dogs exclusively indoors
 - Temperatures, lighting, space allowances





Establishments – Specific obligations (2)



- Health [5 years]
 - Age for first pregnancy, frequency of pregnancies, pregnancies beyond a certain age, etc.
- Behaviour
 - no restraining (few exceptions), no tethering, socialisation, enrichment
- Painful practices
 - No mutilations except medical reasons
 - Neutering and medical mutilations under anesthesia and analgesia by a veterinarian



Breeding establishments approval [5 years]

- Obligation of notification [2 years]
- Competent authorities perform on-site inspection
- Competent authorities grant a certificate of approval
- List of approved establishments publicly available



Shelters and pet shops [2 years]

- Obligation of notification
- Basic information operator, location, capacity
- No requirement for approval



Identification and registration (ID) [3 years]

- Animals microchipped for any supply of dogs or cats + dogs and cats kept in establishments
- Identification and registration in database by a **veterinarian**, or assistant under the responsibility of a veterinarian. Update of database.
- ID within 3 months after birth for breeding establishments
- Suppliers must prove ID and acquirers are able to check ID
- Online platform shall inform acquirers how to check ID
- The Commission in charge of developing a system to check ID





Competent authorities




- Ensure offer and approve training courses for animal caretakers
- Establish and maintain an ID database for dogs and cats [3 years]
- Databases are interoperable to check ID [5 years]
- Provide data to the Commission [6 years]
- Commission in charge of databases standards



Entry into the Union [5 years]

- Only if compliance or equivalent standards
- Third countries listing
- Establishments listing
- Attestation of compliance in the official certificate
- Microchipping compulsory at the entry
- Registration within 48 hours in an EU database





Procedural and other provisions



- Amending the annexes
- Stricter national rules permitted in certain areas
- Reporting and evaluation
- Penalties
- Date of application: 2 years [when not specified otherwise]



Conclusions

- Legal basis 114 + 43 => EU competence focusing on ensuring a good functioning of the market of dogs and cats while ensuring high level of animal welfare (art 13),
 - => no competence on handling by pet owners, or management of stray dog population
- Management of the market => fight against illegal trade => need for comprehensive and robust traceability system (wide scope)
- Suppliers to raise awareness on responsible ownership
